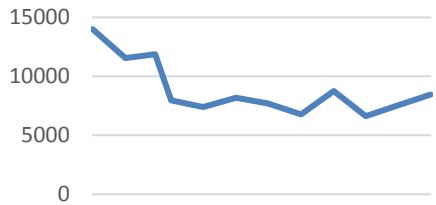

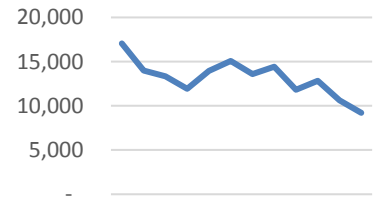

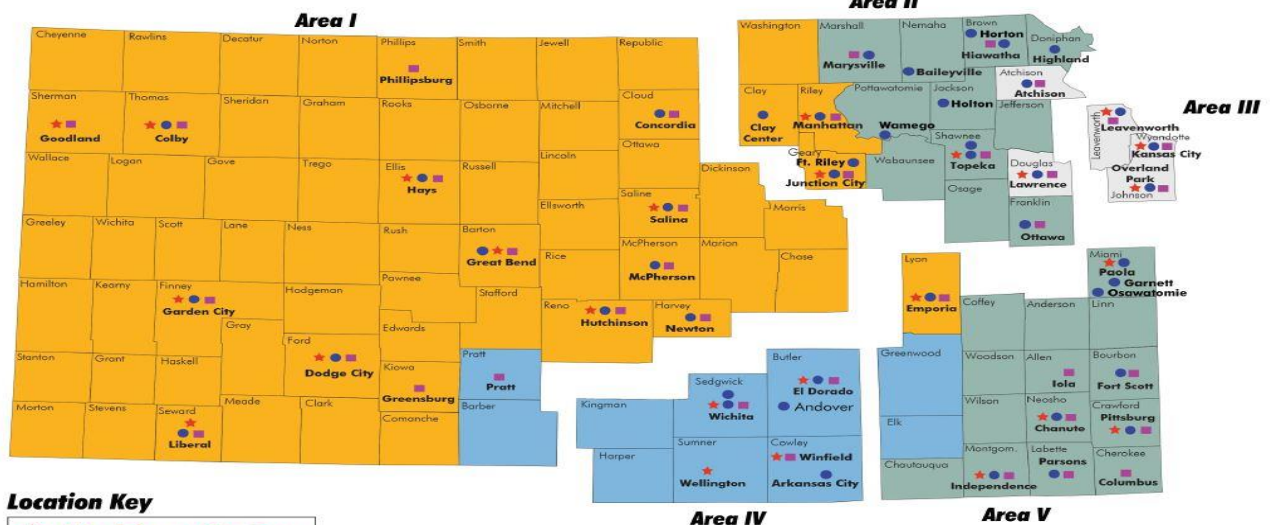

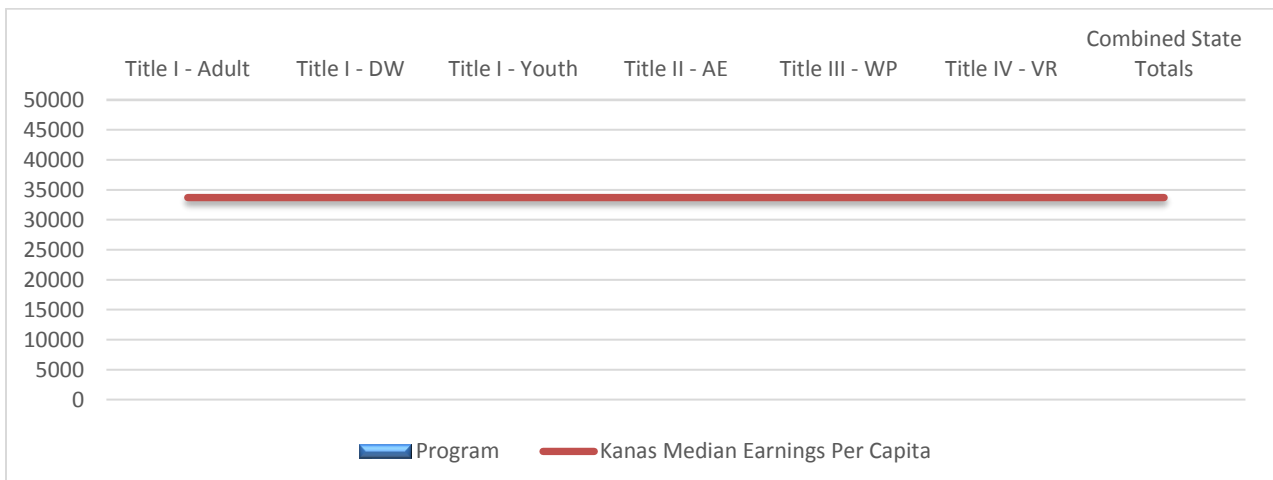

The following Q2 data is submitted as per the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Combined State Plan for Kansas.

1. Educational Functioning Level gain: 37.49%

Kansas adult education providers utilize the TABE assessment which determines the initial learning level for each student. An Educational Functioning Level (EFL) gain is a documented gain based on the initial assessment. The reported percentage represents the number of students who completed the level of instruction for which they were enrolled. As projected, this percentage has more than doubled over the last quarter.

Current enrollment: 4146 students

Total attendance hours: 318,156

2. Measurable Skill Gain: 1391 students

Adult education providers measure the number of students who achieve one of the following: transition to postsecondary education, pass their high school equivalency (GED), or pre- and post-test at an adult education program.

3. Credentials Achieved: 83 Credentials
(272 enrolled in Accelerating Opportunity – Kansas)

Students who achieved an industry-recognized credential.

4. High School Diplomas Achieved: 273

Kansas administers the GED test, and 76% of those attempting the test since July 1 who are enrolled in a Kansas adult education program achieved their GED. A total of 827 Kansans have achieved high school equivalency in this timeframe, with a pass rate of 77% (national pass rate is 72%).

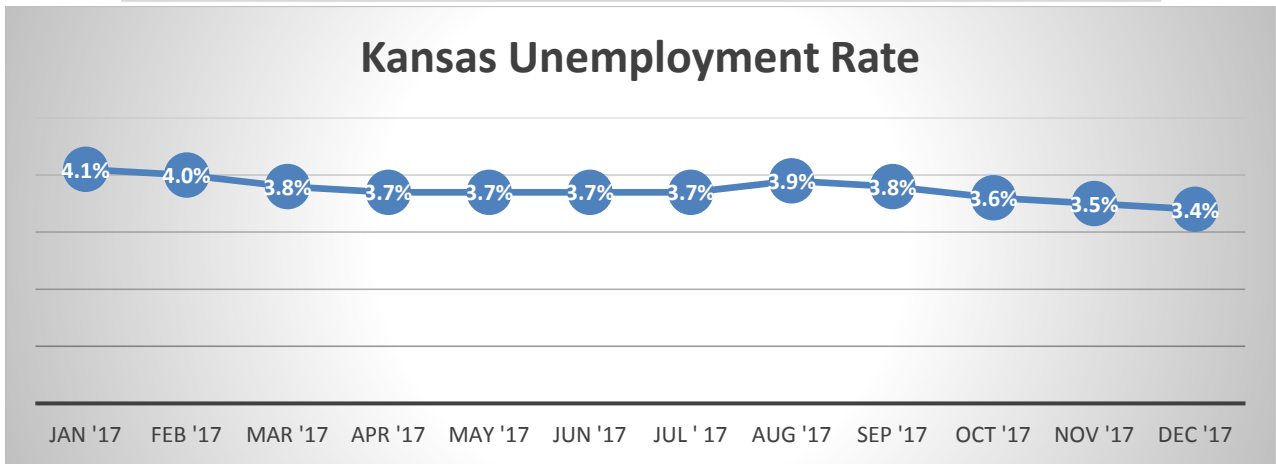
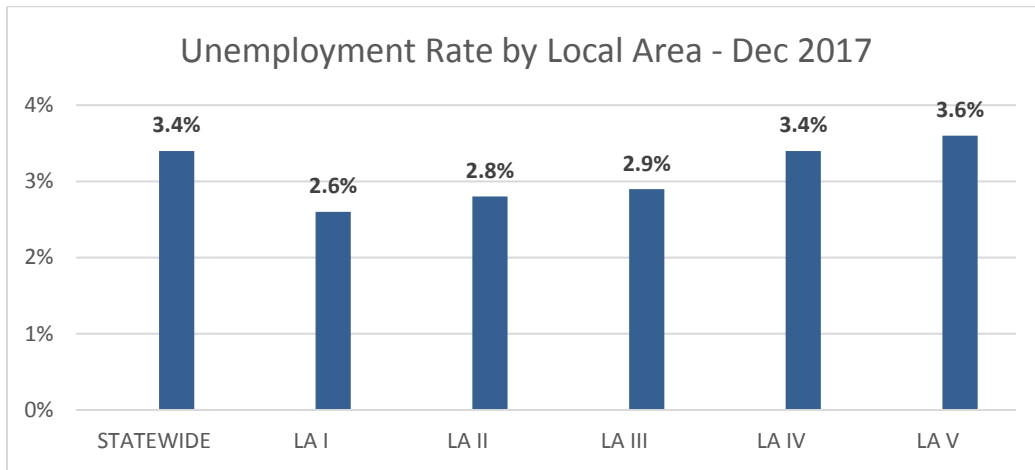

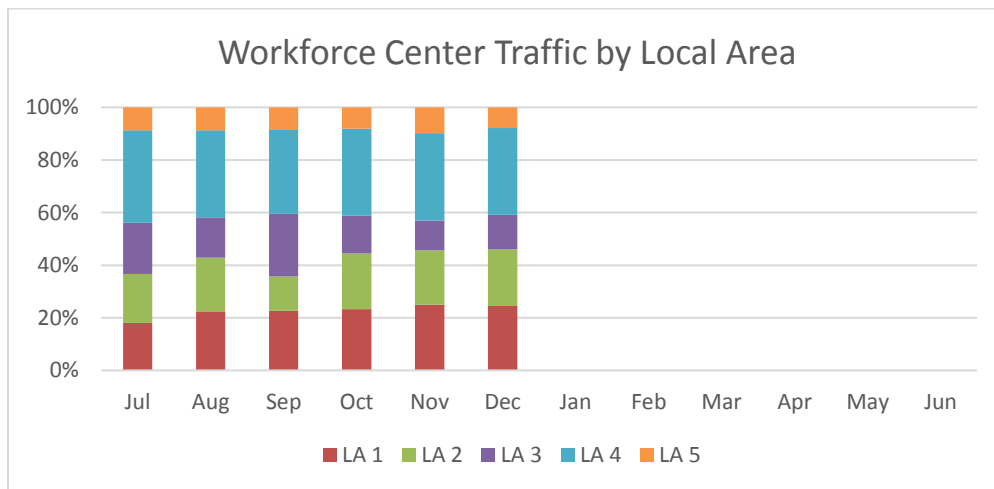
