Frequently Asked Questions:

Question:

Can a local non-profit organization apply for this grant?

Answer:

Yes. An entity with 501(c)(3) status is a qualified respondent. See page 2 of the SGA for a list of qualified respondents.

Question:

If my Local Workforce Development Board has a policy and waiver allowing it to spend only 50% of youth funds on out-of-school youth, can the funds for this solicitation be spent that way?

Answer:

No. The Waiver applies only to Local Formula Allocations. The SGA is funded by the State's Allocation which is not covered by the expenditure Waiver.
